Shared Decision Making

It is in the best interest of the minor children that both parents maintain shared decision-making for all major decisions that affect the children. Such decisions include but are not limited to:

Is NOT permitted without the prior written consent of the other parent. Such consent Shall provide the child(ren)'s itinerary, travel mode, address and contact numbers.

Travel is permitted only to countries that are signatory members of the Hague Convention on Civil Aspects of Child Abduction.

If the other parent travels to such a country that is not a member of the Hague Convention, they shall provide the non-traveling parent an open-ended, round trip airline ticket in case the child(ren) is/are not returned.

OTHER PROVISIONS:
